Dear year 11 parents

End of Term Update and Revision Timetable

As we approach the end of term I am writing to outline the arrangements for next term and during the examination period.

As you know, we had a second round of mock examinations for year 11. Students have been given the results for most of those examinations. You will receive a report on May 10th which will include the results. These results are crucial for the students in planning their revision over the next few weeks. Subject teachers will speak to students about specific topics and areas of focus. Students should be revising for 2 hours a day during the week and 5 hours over the weekend. I would expect them to spend longer than this during the Easter holidays.

All students will receive a maths pack this week. The pack will contain their last mock papers along with an analysis of their answers in the form of a RAG (red, amber, green) rating. Any topics highlighted in amber or red need to be revised. The analysis will direct the students to the appropriate Maths Watch clip for support. After Easter and before the examinations start, maths interventions will take place every day after school.

Over the Easter break there will be revision taking place in school for most subjects. Maths revision will be by invitation only and takes place on Monday 15th April. The schedule for revision was sent to you last week. To enable students to utilise the IT facilities in school the Learning Resource Centre will be open every day (except the bank holidays) from 10 a.m. until 2 p.m. This facility will be supervised by a member of staff for silent study and students may be asked to leave if they are not studying silently.

After the Easter holidays the students have just two weeks before their examinations start. During that two week period lessons will continue as normal. From Monday 13th May, year 11 students will start their revision timetable. The revision timetable will be sent to you in a separate communication. Students are expected to attend school at 8:30 a.m. each day for timetabled revision or examinations. There are two days when some students will not be required to attend; those days are highlighted on the timetable. During this period there will be a room allocated for silent study throughout the day should any of our students prefer to stay in school. On days where there are no afternoon exams, students will be permitted to go home to study. Any student whose behaviour is disruptive between now and 13th May will be put on early study leave.



The last examinations for all year 11 students will in the morning of Friday 14th June. Students will leave straight after their examination and will not be required to attend after this date. GCSE results will be published on Thursday 22nd August and will be available from 9 a.m. at Health Futures.

If you have any questions about the content of this letter or any other issues please contact me by email. I will be picking up emails over the Easter holiday period. We will break up for Easter at 3.50p.m. on Friday 12th April and return on Monday 29th April.

I would like to take this opportunity to wish you and your families an enjoyable bank holiday, thank you for your continuing support and wish your daughter or son the very best of luck in their upcoming examinations.
