As we approach the end of the first term of this academic year I am writing to give you some updates and to let you know about the arrangements for the end of term.

Our year 11 and 13 students are currently taking their first round of mock exams. Students have been working hard and will receive their results on our mock result day on January 17<sup>th</sup>. The mock result day mirrors the real results day next August and gives students a taste of opening their results in a formal setting. It is followed by a reflective session with their tutors where they will be able to identify any areas for improvement and set targets for the months ahead before the real exams. You will receive a report on the same day which will include results and predicted grades. There will be a year 11 parents' evening the following week. The second round of mocks will be in March.

Next week will also be the final showcase event for our second employer project this year, 'Living Your Best Life'. Our students have learnt about the dangers of overuse of antibiotics, healthy diet and exercise, prevention of illness and disease through immunisation and screening and sexual health. The showcase will run from 10 a.m. until 12 p.m. and parents are welcome to join our employer partners to see what the students have learnt throughout the 6 weeks of the project. During the afternoon we will be taking students into Birmingham for a fun and festive visit to the Christmas market. Please return the appropriate paperwork with consent for the trip as soon as possible. If your daughter or son is in year 10 or year 11 and you are happy for them to travel home from Birmingham we will require your consent. Thursday next week will be a normal teaching day and it is essential that all students attend. Christmas lunch will be available to students at a cost of £3.00. On Friday students will be in lessons for the first part of the morning and then, after assembly, will leave at 12:30 p.m. On Friday, for £1, students can wear a Christmas jumper as part of a non-uniform day to raise money for Save the Children.
