Update from Health Futures UTC

I hope you and your families are keeping well at this challenging time.

I am just writing to update you on a few things from Health Futures and to reassure you about your place with us in September.

At the moment all of our students, including year 11 and year 13, are following their normal timetables remotely. Our students have been registering with us at 8:30 each morning and have completed all of their lessons throughout the day. We have been communicating with them via email and have ensured that the system we have in place does not rely on students having laptops or printers at home. The students have been truly fantastic and almost all have engaged with every lesson. We have been in touch with the parents of any student who fails to register for a lesson and this very quickly reengages them. I am really proud of the students and of the team at Health Futures who are working really hard to keep the education of our students going during this difficult time.

You will have received an email on Wednesday from one of our assistant principals, Miss Griffith, inviting you to join in with our latest project. I appreciate that all schools have developed their own virtual learning system and, for some of you, additional work will not be feasible. You may not be aware that Health Futures was inspected by Ofsted in February. The report has now been published and can be accessed via the Ofsted website or through our school website. We were delighted to have come out of Special Measures after only 21 months.

Whilst none of us is sure how long schools will have to remain closed, we are ensuring that we are in a position to re-open at any time. I am hoping that this will be at the beginning of June, after May half term. With this in mind we are planning to hold induction days at the following times:

We do have a contingency plan in place in the event of the above events having to be postponed.
