HOME SCHOOL AGREEMENT

1. Introduction

Health Futures UTC (the UTC) has high expectations of itself, its staff, its students and the relationship we build with our students' families. We believe that a student is most likely to be successful when there is a strong, open and honest relationship between the UTC and our students' families. We also believe that frequent and timely communication between all parties is important to the maintenance of this relationship. The Home School Agreement sets out the basis for this relationship and makes clear expectations of all parties.

2. Health Futures UTC will:

- Provide an induction programme that will help students make the transition to the UTC
- Provide a professional and caring learning environment with clear systems of support and intervention that meets students' needs
- Provide a fulfilling and challenging education that is of the highest standard
- Work with partners to provide high quality health and science related learning and enrichment opportunities
- Encourage and support all students to realise their potential, recognising a student's successes and supporting them through any difficulties
- Provide regular assessment of work with constructive feedback on how students' work can be improved
- Track the progress and achievements of all students and keep them and their parents informed and up to date
- Communicate with the home regularly on aspects of school life including students' progress, achievement, attendance and pastoral issues (where necessary or appropriate)
- Provide support, information, advice and guidance on further and higher education and employment opportunities
- Provide access to a range of curricular and extra-curricular activities and experiences to enrich and broaden students education

3. Students will:

- Engage fully with the induction programme and work with the staff of Health Futures UTC to build our school community
- Respect and comply with the standards of professional dress and behaviour required by Health Futures and show due consideration for fellow students
- Recognise and accept their responsibility for their learning, asking for help whenever they need it and accessing support that helps them to fulfil their potential
- Use the facilities and resources of the UTC productively and carefully, respecting any relevant policies and the needs of the school community

- Arrive on time every day and for all lessons and aim for 100% attendance
- Respect and value the contributions and opportunities that employer partners bring to their learning
- Behave in a mature and professional manner whenever representing the UTC, respecting the ethos and values of the environment
- Respond positively to teachers' feedback, recognising that learning is often strongest when it relates to previous mistakes
- Engage positively with enrichment and extra-curricular activities
