

16-19 TUITION FUND STATEMENT

What is the 16-19 tuition fund?

The 16 to 19 tuition fund is ring-fenced funding for schools, colleges and all other 16 to 19 institutions who receive annual funding allocations from ESFA for the provision of 16 to 19 education, to mitigate the disruption to learning arising from coronavirus (COVID-19).

The funding is to support small group tuition for students aged 16 to 19 in English, maths and other subjects that have been disrupted, including vocational and/or academic learning.

- have not achieved a grade 4 or 5 in English and/or maths
- have a grade 4 or above in English and/or maths, are from an economically disadvantaged background and would need catch-up support. These are defined as students from the 27% most economically deprived areas of the country based on the index of multiple deprivation

How will Health Futures UTC use the funding?

At Health Futures we will receive £13,499 and we intend to utilise this sum to provide additional support to small groups of students that have not yet achieved a grade 4 in mathematics or English.

We will use the funding, as follows:

- To pay for additional tuition for year 13 students who have still not attained English and/or maths GCSE at grade 4 or above. This tuition will be in addition to their timetabled lessons, will be provided through an external provider and will be delivered to students in the run up to their GCSE retake in November 2021.
- To enable students in year 12, preparing to resit their GCSE in English and/or maths, to learn Functional Skills in addition to English language and maths in order to build up their confidence and ensure they gain an additional qualification in the subject
- To purchase bespoke resources for students on the post 16 level 2 programme to enable them to complete the Prince's Trust qualification to support their learning and progress and prepare them for the world of work.

This statement is in line with the Government guidance and we have published this statement to demonstrate how this additional funding will be utilised in the academic year 2021/22. This document may be updated to reflect any changes in ESFA guidance.
